## Does your pet have bad breath?

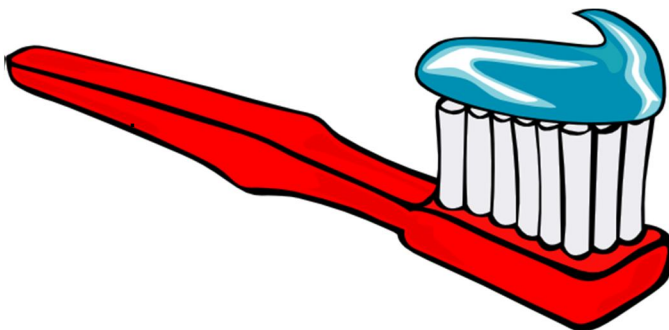
If so, you may consider having a dental cleaning done!

“As plaque and calculus develop below the gum line, professional cleaning will be needed to help manage it. If the plaque and tartar build up continues unchecked, infection can form around the root of the tooth” (American Animal Health Association Dental Care Guidelines for Dogs and Cats, 2013)
